Why we use presentations, and choosing a presentation tool

By the end of the lesson, the learner should be able to: a) explain the importance of presentation tools; b) compare presentation tools and choose one for a purpose

Presentation tools

A presentation tool is a program used to make slides that support a talk. Slides can hold short text, pictures, charts, tables, sound and video. A good presentation helps the audience follow, understand and remember the main points, and helps the speaker stay organised.

Presentations are used in class lessons, project reports, meetings, business proposals, community campaigns and training. Common tools are Microsoft PowerPoint, Google Slides, LibreOffice Impress and Canva. Choose by asking: does it work offline or online, what does it cost, does it have the templates and features I need, can I work with others on it, and will the file open on the computer I will present from?
